## **Appendix A: Animal Names in the Bible with Explanations**

In the opening pages of God's message to mankind, we find that animal names can be very important:

And out of the ground the Lord God formed every beast of the field and every bird of the sky, and brought them to the man to see what he would call them; and whatever the man called a living creature, that was his name. (Genesis 2:19, NASB)

The list presented below contains the animal names as they appear in the sixty-six books of Scripture along with a few notes of explanation to enhance the reader's ability to understand the animals involved.

Keep the following in mind when studying the list:

- The primary focus of the study is on the role the animals play in the Bible, not on developing a scientific taxonomy of the animal each name represents.
- Disease causing organisms, such as *pestilence*, are not considered animals.
- The names in **bold** are used in the King James Version (KJV); whereas, those in *italics* are <u>some</u> examples of how those names appear in other translations.
- (OT) indicates the name appears only in the Old Testament; (NT) indicates the name appears only in the New Testament; (OT+NT) indicates the name appears in both.
- The names marked with an \* are not animals per se, but their names refer to animals (e.g., *shepherd*, *goatskin*, etc.) See also the \* note at the end of this document.

## **Notes:**

- "Two great creatures, behemoth and leviathan, are described by God in Job. Some commentators have suggested behemoth was an elephant or hippo, but the description simply doesn't match (behemoth 'moves his tail like a cedar'). It appears God is describing a sauropod dinosaur and a fearsome, now-extinct sea creature" (Steel 2001).
- "Obviously behemoth is represented as the primeval beast, the king of all the animals of the dry land, while leviathan is the king . . . of all those of the water, both alike unconquerable by man" (Singer 1912, 8:38).
- \* These are not animals per se, but their names refer to animals. All are nouns except for *lionlike*, which is an adjective and is used to describe people.
